About the Program

“Youth on Board” is a program that connects our young leaders with established leaders in our community. Young leaders, between the ages of 18–23 are matched with mentors who sit on local Boards of Directors. This program provides the opportunity for young leaders to learn about board governance and, with the assistance of their mentors, participate in the governance of a local social profit organization for a minimum period of six months.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

To seek opportunities for young leaders to engage with local boards of directors in order to:

- Increase their knowledge of board governance practices through hands-on experiences
- Expand their networks by building bridges with established leaders
- Encourage a youth perspective at the board level
- Encourage established community leaders to mentor young leaders

Expectations

BECOME A MENTOR!

- You are a current Director of a local social profit organization
- You can commit to participating for a minimum of 6 months between October and June
- You will connect with the young leader prior to board meetings
- You will act as the ongoing liaison between the young leader and the organization for events, committee work and any new opportunities for involvement
- You will provide opportunities for the young leader to ask questions and participate in board meetings

- Are between the ages of 18–23
- Have demonstrated leadership skills and an interest in learning about social profit governance
- Can commit to participating for a minimum period of 6 months between October and June

- Will ask questions, seek opportunities, and participate in board meetings
- Will participate as non-voting members and abide by the boards’ confidentiality policies
